




Operant Conditioning

Antecedent, Behavior, Consequences (Cognitive Choices & Their Results)

The Four Quadrants of Operant Conditioning



Compatible Force-Free Quadrants

Positive Reinforcement

- Adding something (treat, toy, praise) to strengthen a behavior
- Dog sits instead of jumping up and gets a treat

Negative Punishment

- Taking away
 something (like
 attention) to stop a
 behavior
- Dog jumps up, person turns away and stops petting dog

Reinforcers

Primary

- □ Food
- Play
- Exercise
- Petting

Conditioned / Secondary

- Clicker
- □ Ball
- Leash
- □ Food Dish






Counter-Conditioning / Desensitization



Physical, Mental, Social Needs




Differential Reinforcement of An Incompatible Behavior & Antecedent Arrangement



Other Factors to Consider When Training

Emotions over-rule logical thought / desire to learn


Amygdala actually "shuts off" the cognitive part of the brain when dog is in "flight or flight"



Trigger Stacking

As Cortisol Levels Rise, Cognitive Ability Decreases

Displacement Behaviors / Calming Signals







Sometimes play before training is best




Drop-lt & the 2-Ball Retrieve




